

"Urban Growth, Natural Disasters and Gentrification"

"Over the past five years, Nashville, TN has been evolving with explosive growth, creeping gentrification, and skyrocketing housing costs. Not only are Nashville residents trying to navigate the effects of becoming the most popular city in America, but this city was also

devastated by both a tornado and a global pandemic in March of this year (2020) alone. This class will study and analyze the effects that natural disasters and gentrification (or a combination of both) can have on a city that is in the thrusts of an urban development boom. Through research, design, thinking and creative problem solving, the students will design a project, or a solution, that could influence positive change for the forgotten communities and residents of Nashville, Tennessee."




The Color of Law
